These initial HopeHouse properties are being sponsored by Glad Tidings Church in West Lawn. HRM's goal is to have a sponsor church for each future HopeHouse to encourage the spiritual community among the residents and build relationships with the surrounding neighbors. As Mr. Turchi shared at the Gala, "There is so much light and love shining on our five acre campus through our daily volunteers. It is time to shine that light throughout the City, while providing affordable housing to those who have graduated from our shelter programs."
