Lives Like John's

Most guests of The Mission Men's Center say one of their biggest struggles is a lack of money and resources. John B. says the opposite—having a lot of money ruined his life.

While working as a pipe fitter at an oil refinery just outside Philadelphia, John sustained lifethreating injuries after a serious accident.

John had a long medical road to recovery, and he was awarded a substantial monetary settlement.

John got married and started his own family. He bought an expensive house in Bucks County, a vacation shore house, a boat, a corvette, and he gave money to family members. John blames idle time from not working and access to a large amount of money as his downfall. He began abusing alcohol and cocaine.

John got divorced and saw his son fall into addiction. He went to different recovery programs, but when he entered a faith-based program and focused on his spiritual life, that's when he says he gained the clarity he needed to turn from his addiction and rebuild his life.

John bought a house in Reading and moved his mother in with him, so that he could take care of her in her retirement. His mother passed away in October of 2021, and John wrestled with depression and temptation to turn back to his addictions. John learned of Hope and came in September 2022, because he knew he needed to be in a supportive environment that focused on faith.

John says he has felt much closer to God since he arrived. John says he needs encouragement and support not to fall back into addiction, as he struggles with temptations to return to what he knows is wrong.

To support John and many others who are either in active addiction or struggling to stay in recovery, Hope is now the host site of a drug and alcohol counseling clinic, Naaman Center, through PA Adult & Teen Challenge. Naaman Center staff have three state-licensed offices to offer intake interviews, individual counseling, and group counseling sessions.

Through this ministry partnership, guests of Hope have unprecedented access to on-site assessments and professional counseling.

Lives are being rescued. Lives are being rebuilt. Lives like John's.
